I used the "Shoot from a Lower Angle" tip by laying down underneath the tree and capturing images from lower, diagonal angles that are more visually interesting (right and top left photos).



I used the "Fill the Frame" tip by pointing my camera through the largest glass. This filled the whole frame with the bright orange glass and the melting snow drops on top of it (bottom left photo).
